## Beemerville Presbyterian to welcome new minister

Young said his heart went out to the people, especially the children, because of the poverty of the area.

In China he taught English to future English teachers in a rural government school.

Young grew up in Wantage. Dr. Charles Jenkins, a previous pastor of the Beemerville church, was one of Young's mentors.

"I am looking forward to doing Christ's work in the area where I grew up," Young said.

Young and Heins will be greeting at the Christmas Eve candlelight service at 7 p.m. in the Beemerville Presbyterian Church, 226 Route 519, Wantage.
